Angeleah Browdy obtained a Ph.D. in Biological Sciences with a concentration in the area of Food Science and Technology from University of Rhode Island, and has been a lecturer in the Food Science and Human Nutrition Department at UF since that time. Her research interest has been in the area of sphingolipid biosynthesis, focusing primarily on protein purification and regulation of the enzymatic pathways using yeast as model systems.
